Present continuous (be + V-ing)			
	+	–	?
I	am('m) working	am('m) not working	Am I working, studying, watching?
he	is('s) working	isn't working	Is he working?
she	is('s) studying	isn't studying	Is she studying?
it	is('s) watching	isn't watching	Is it watching?
we	are('re) working	aren't working	Are we working?
you	are('re) studying	aren't studying	Are you studying?
they	are('re) watching	aren't watching	Are they watching?

be going to (be + going to + V)			
I	am('m) going to work	am('m) not going to work	Am I not going to work
he	is('s) going to work	isn't going to work	Is he going to work
she	is('s) going to study	isn't going to study	Is she going to study
it	is('s) going to watch	isn't going to watch	Is it going to watch
we	are('re) going to work	aren't going to work	Are we going to work
you	are('re) going to study	aren't going to study	Are you going to study
they	are('re) going to watch	aren't going to watch	Are they going to watch

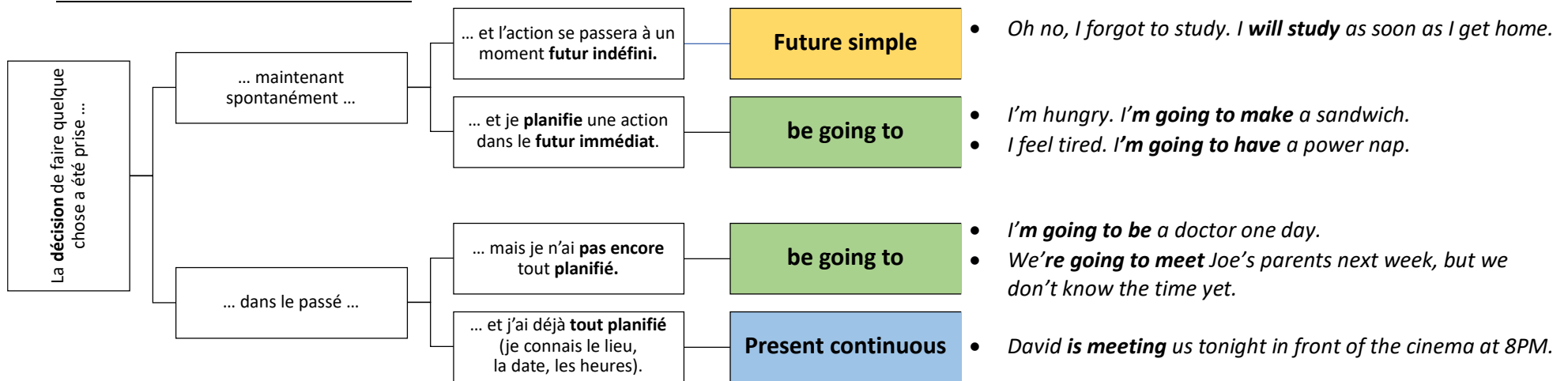
Future simple (will + V)			
I	will work	won't work	Will I work?
he	will work	won't work	Will he work?
she	will study	won't study	Will she study?
it	will watch	won't watch	Will it watch?
we	will work	won't work	Will we work?
you	will study	won't study	Will you study?
they	will watch	won't watch	Will they watch?

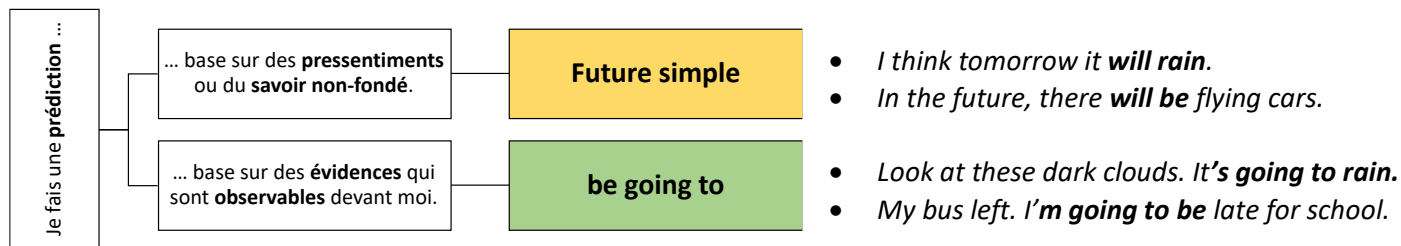

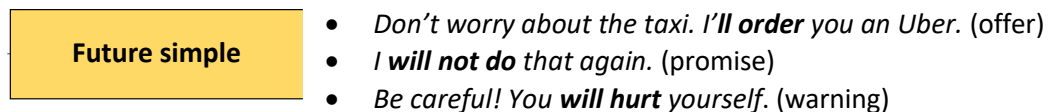

You can use **probably, definitely / certainly** to express your certainty that something will happen in the future.

⚠ Be careful with the word order when there is a negative ⚠

- *I **will certainly** pass the test.*
- *We **probably won't** go to France.*
- *You're **definitely not** going to catch the bus.*
