


#### **Pronunciation**

(How to Pronounce the Ending of Regular Past Simple Verbs)

/d/ /id/ /t/ loved watched wanted listened asked painted shouted closed washed missed studied played saved laughed needed etc. etc. etc.

OK... so what now?

It's all about **phonetic symbols**.

# /id/

It's the easiest rule to know.

When a regular verb finishes in /d/ or /t/ sounds, the -ed pronunciation is /id/.

need - needed /ni:d/ - /ni:did/

want - wanted /wpnt/ - /wpntid/

paint - painted
/peint/ - /peinted/

etc.


