


#### **Ordinal Numbers**

1st = first •	11 <sup>th</sup> = eleventh	21st = twenty-first •
2 <sup>nd</sup> = second •	12 <sup>th</sup> = twelfth ●	22 <sup>nd</sup> = twenty-second ●
3 <sup>rd</sup> = third •	13 <sup>th</sup> = thirteenth	23 <sup>rd</sup> = twenty-third ●
4 <sup>th</sup> = fourth	14 <sup>th</sup> = fourteenth	24 <sup>th</sup> = twenty-fourth
5 <sup>th</sup> = fifth •	15 <sup>th</sup> = fifteenth	25 <sup>th</sup> = twenty-fifth


= irregular, spelling or pronunciation

Nine becomes ninth, not nineth.

There are 4 consecutive consonants in twelfth.

From twenty to ninety (only the tens), the ordinal number pronunciation is /iəθ/ and not /iθ/. twentieth, thirtieth, fortieth, fiftieth, etc.

Don't forget to write the two last letters of the ordinal numbers in superscript!

I was born **on** the 7th of the month.

For months we use in.

For example:

I was born **in** September.

My birthday is **on** September the 7th.






When were you born? When's your birthday?




#### **Phonetic Symbols**
